



Edinburgh and South East Regional Claimant Count July 2024 Summary Update

City Region Summary

- 1. In June 2024 the claimant count for the City Region was 24,980 (in May it was 24,170). Of these
 - a. 4,405 were 16-24 year olds up from 4,345 in May.
 - b. 15,125 were 25-49 year olds up from 14,495 in May.
 - c. 5,440 were 50 or older up from 5,330 in May.
- 2. In May 2024 there were 47,259 working individuals claiming Universal Credit in the Region. In April 2024 there were 47,191.

Edinburgh Summary

- 1. In June 2024 the claimant count for Edinburgh was 9,060 (in May it was 8,760). Of these
 - a. 1,265 were 16-24 year olds. It was 1,230 in May.
 - b. 5,790 were 25-49 year olds. It was 5,565 in May.
 - c. 2,005 were 50 or older. It was 1,965 in May.
- 2. In May 2024 there were 14,918 working individuals claiming Universal Credit in Edinburgh. In April 2024 there were 15,092.

East Lothian Summary

- 1. In June 2024 the claimant count for East Lothian was 1,635 (in May it was 1,575). Of these
 - a. 280 were 16-24 year olds. In May there were 280.
 - b. 970 were 25-49 year olds. In May there were 930.
 - c. 385 were 50 or older. In May there were 365.
- 2. In May 2024 there were 3,780 working individuals claiming Universal Credit in East Lothian. In April 2024 there were 3,846.

Fife Summary

- 1. In June 2024 the claimant count for Fife was 7,755 (in May it was 7,360). Of these
 - a. 1,610 were 16-24 year olds. In May there were 1,550.
 - b. 4,530 were 25-49 years of age. In May there were 4,255.
 - c. 1,610 were 50 or older. In May there were 1,555.
- 2. In May 2024 there were 13,991 working individuals claiming Universal Credit in Fife. In April 2024 there were 13,489.

Midlothian Summary

- 1. In June 2024 the claimant count for Midlothian was 1,330 (it was 1,305 in May). Of these
 - a. 260 were 16-24 year olds. In May it was 255.
 - b. 815 were 25-49 year olds. In May it was 810.
 - c. 250 were 50 or older. In May it was 240.
- 2. In May 2024 there were 3,549 working individuals claiming Universal Credit in Midlothian. In April there were 3,591.

Scottish Borders Summary

- 1. In June 2024 the claimant count for Scottish Borders was 2,065 (in May it was 2,055). Of these
 - a. 350 were 16-24 year olds. In May it was 350.
 - b. 1,115 were 25-49 year olds. In May there were 1,105.
 - c. 600 were 50 or older. In May there were 600.
- 2. In May 2024 there were 4,029 working individuals claiming Universal Credit in Scottish Borders. In April there were 4,025.

West Lothian Summary

- 1. In June 2024 the claimant count for West Lothian was 3,135 (in May it was 3,115). Of these
 - a. 640 were 16-24 year olds. In May there were 680.
 - b. 1,905 were 25-49 year olds. In May there were 1,830.
 - c. 590 were 50 or older. In May there were 605.
- 2. In May 2024 there were 6989 in West Lothian individuals claiming Universal Credit who were in work. In April there were 7,147.



Edinburgh and South East Regional Claimant Count July 2024 Full Update

Claimant Count by Nation and Region

Table 1 indicates that in the UK the claimant count in June 2024 is higher than it was five years ago. This is the same in every region and nation apart from the North East of England. In Scotland it is 1.1% higher than in June 2019 and in the UK, it is 46.4% higher. We can also see that in all but two regions and countries of the UK the claimant count in June 2024 is higher than it was in June 2023. In Scotland the claimant count has fallen by 0.6% between June 2023 and June 2024

Looking at the latest change month to month it can be seen in the table that across the UK the claimant count is 3.7% higher in than in May. In Scotland it is 3.1% higher (3,330) in June 2024 than it was in May.

Claimant Count by Scottish Local Authority

Table 2 focuses on Scottish Local Authorities. We can see that 11 Scottish Local Authorities have a claimant count higher in June 2024 than was recorded in June 2023 and three of these are in the City Region. In the City Region as a whole the claimant count in June 2024 is 0.9% higher than in June 2023.

Looking at how June 2024 compares to May 2024. We can see that across Scotland only five Local Authorities saw the claimant count fall over the last month. Every Local Authority in the City Region recorded a month to month increase and this ranged from 5.4% increase in Fife to 0.5% increase in Scottish Borders.


Looking at the longer term we can see that 10 Local Authorities have a claimant count higher than it was in 2019. This ranges from 48.4% higher in Edinburgh through to 2.5% higher in Shetland. In the UK as a whole there are 178 Local Authorities where a claimant count in June 2024 is higher than five years ago. For example, Cambridge 94% higher, Leeds 64%, Manchester 62%, Nottingham 59% and Newham 180% higher than in 2019.

Figure 2, below, looks at the claimant rate for all the Scottish Local Authorities as recorded in June 2024. From this it can be seen that, except for Fife, all the City Region Local Authorities had a claimant rate below the Scottish average. For Midlothian the claimant rate is low enough to place it within the ten Local Authorities with the lowest claimant rate in the country.

City Region Position

Looking in more detail at the position in the City Region. It can be seen in Table 3 that across the region the claimant count recorded in June 2024 is higher than it was in June 2023. However, this change is not universal and three Local Authorities have seen it increase over the year and three have seen it fall.

The month-to-month change from May 2024 to June 2024 indicates that in all six Local Authorities the claimant count is higher than it was month ago. Fife recorded a month to month increase of 5.4% between May and June, East Lothian a 3.8% rise, Edinburgh a 3.4% month to month increase and Midlothian a 1.9% increase.

The data presented in Table 4 indicates that across the region in April 2024 there were 47,191 people who were in work but required financial support from Universal Credit (UC) as their income was not sufficient. In May 2024 this had increased by 0.1% to 47,259. This was reflected in two of the six Local Authorities whilst the other four saw the in work claimant count fall.

Gender Profile

From Table 5 we can see that two Local Authorities in the city region have seen the number of male claimants fall over the last 12 months and three have seen the number increase. Across the region the number of male claimants in June 2024 was 300 lower than in June 2023.

Comparing the May 2024 statistics to those of June 2024 the picture is similarly mixed as three Local Authorities recorded a fall in the claimant count for males and three saw it increase. This culminated in the region as a whole recording a 1.0% increase between May and June 2024.

Table 6 looks at the situation for female claimants. This indicates that over the last year there has been an increase in the number of female claimants (just over 500 additional female claimants). Compare this to the male claimant count which has fallen by 300 over the same period. This is an increase of 5.1% year on year compared to a fall of 2.0% year on year for the number of male claimants.

In one Local Authority (Midlothian) the female claimant count has fallen year on year whilst all other Local Authorities saw the number of female claimants increase over the twelve months.

Between May 2024 and June 2024, the number of female claimants increased in all Local Authorities leading to an additional 600 or so female claimants in June.

Table 7 below looks at the gender split of those who are in work and claiming Universal Credit. The data indicates that across the City Region in May 2023, 26,952 female claimants were in work and claiming Universal Credit. In May 2024 the number had increased to 30,698. This is nearly 4,000 more than 12 months ago. Compare this to the male in work Universal Credit claimant count, which was 15,302 in May 2023 and currently (May 2024) is sitting at 16,555. Table 7 shows that across the region, and in each Local Authority, there are a far higher proportion of women who are in work, but their earnings are so low that they qualify for in work Universal Credit. In May 2023 males comprised 36% of Universal Credit claimants whilst in May 2024 this was 35%.

Age Profile

16-24 Year Olds

In May 2024 there were 4,345 claimants aged between 16-24 years of age in the City Region. In June this had increased slightly to 4,405 - an increase of 1.0%. In two of the six Local Authorities there had been no real change in the number of 16-24 year old claimants between May and June. West Lothian saw a fall of 5.9% and the others saw an increase ranging from 2.0% in Midlothian to an increase of 3.9% in Fife.

The year on year figure shows a 0.1% fall across the region from 4,410 in June 2023 to 4,405 in June 2024. When each of the six Local Authorities are looked at, the year on year change ranges from a fall of 8.2% in East Lothian through to a 5.4% increase year on year in Edinburgh. One thing to bear in mind is that a relatively small numerical change can result in what can look to be significant percentage changes for example that 8.2% fall in East Lothian is based on the number of claimants falling from 305 to 280.

25-49 Year Olds

Table 9 allows us to look at what has been happening in terms of 25–49-year-olds, the age band that captures the highest claimant numbers. Across the City Region there were 15,125 25–49-year-olds claiming in June 2024, and this is up 2.1% from 14,820 in June 2023. We can see from the table that four Local Authorities recorded a year on year increase and this ranged from 0.6% in Midlothian (an increase of only 5 claimants) to a 9% increase in East Lothian where the claimant count went from 890 in June 2023 to 970 in June 2024.

In terms of month to month changes we can see that across the City Region the number of 25-49 year old claimants increased by 4.3% between May and June – an additional 630 claimants. This ranged from a 0.6% increase in Midlothian to a 6.5% increase in Fife. Fife saw the claimant count increase from 4,255 in May 2024 to 4,530 in June 2024.

50 Year Olds and Over

Table 10 looks at what has been happening in terms of those over the age of fifty. Across the City Region we can see that in May 2024 there were 5,330 claimants who were fifty or over. This has increased by 2.1% so that in June 2024 there were 5,440 claimants who fell into this age category. In four of the six Local Authorities there has also been a month to month increase in the number of claimants 50 years of age or older. The two that didn't see this increase were West Lothian where there was a 2.5% fall in the number of claimants and Scottish Borders where the claimant count was the same in June as it was in May.

When we look at was has happened over the last year, we can see that the City Region has seen a fall of 1.5% and has 85 fewer claimants aged 50 or over in June 2024 than in June 2023. Looking at the Local Authorities three also recorded a fall over the twelve month period and the others saw the claimant count for those over 50 increase.

Overall, there are 9,060 claimants in Edinburgh in June 2024, and this is 5.3% higher than June 2023 and 3.4% higher than in May 2024. From the table we can see that in June 2024 four wards had 750 or more claimants, ten wards had more than 500 and 1 ward had less than 200.

The table also indicates that twelve wards had a claimant count higher in June 2024 than in May. We can see that in Pentland Hills the claimant count is 15.7% higher than a year ago (up by 110 claimants over the course of the year). Morningside is 9.8% higher in June than it was in May. Over the last month 2 wards saw the claimant count fall and three recorded no real change.

Overall, in Edinburgh in April 2024, 58.3% of claimants were male and 14.0% are aged 16-24. The City Centre ward records that 70.4% of the claimants are male. Drum Brae and Gyle ward has the highest proportion of female claimants at 47.6%. In Corstorphine/Murrayfield and in Morningside 26.7% of claimants in June were over 50 years of age, the highest proportion in the city and in Colinton/Farmilehead 20.8% of claimants were 16-24 years of age.

Table 12 below looks at the in-work Universal Credit claimant count for the Edinburgh wards. This indicates that there are 1,555 people in Forth Ward who are working but their earnings are low enough that they can receive Universal Credit. This is higher than it was a year ago but almost the same as it was in April 2024. Overall, four wards have more in work claimants than last month and all but one (Leith) have more claimants than a year ago.

East Lothian

Table 13 below looks at the situation in the East Lothian Wards. Overall, the county has a claimant count of 1,635 which is 3.8% higher than it was last month and 5.1% higher than in June 2023. Over the last year we can see that four wards recorded a month to month increase and two recorded a fall. Dunbar and East Linton has recorded a 30% increase in the claimant count over the course of a year (up to 195 in June 2024 from 150 in June 2023). Dunbar and East Linton also recorded the largest percentage rise month to month in the county where 20 additional claimants resulted in a 11.4% rise between May and June. Over the last month only Haddington and Lammermuir recorded a fall in the claimant count with every other ward in the county seeing the number of claimants increase.

Across the county 55.4% of claimants are male and this varies from 50% in North Berwick Coastal to 57.8% in Musselburgh. Preston, Seton and Gosford ward has the highest proportion of 16-24 year old claimants (19.1%). North Berwick Coastal has the highest proportion (30%) of over 50 year olds.

Table 14 looks at those claiming Universal Credit in East Lothian who are in work and presents the results by ward. Overall, there has been an increase between May 2023 and May 2024 of 9.6%. This ranges from a 21% increase in working Universal Credit claimants in Dunbar and East Linton (around 90 additional claimants over the year) to a fall of 2.4% in North Berwick Coastal. Between April 2024 and May 2024, the count fell by 1.7% in the County and only two East Lothian wards recorded month to month increase.

Fife

Turning now to look at Fife. We can see that overall Fife recorded 7,755 claimants in June 2024 and of these 58.1% were male. Five wards had over 500 claimants in April and four had 200 or less. Overall, there are 3.5% fewer claimants in Fife than in June 2023 and 5.4% more than in May 2024. We can see that year on year, six wards (Burntisland, East Neuk and Landward, Glenrothes North, Leslie and Markinch, Howe of Fife and Tay, Lochgelly Cardenden and Benarty and Tay Bridgehead) have seen the claimant count increase. Tay Bridgehead has seen the claimant count increase by 34.3% over the last 12 months, up from 175 in June 2023 to 235 in June 2024. The remainder recorded a fall. Dunfermline South has seen the claimant count fall by 12.2% over the last year.

Between April and May 2024, the claimant count decreased in one Fife ward (Dunfermline North) and remained the same in one ward (St Andrews). The remaining wards all saw the claimant count increase between May and June. East Neuk and Landward saw the claimant count increase by 16.7% between May and June based on an increase from 150 to 175 claimants. The ward with the single highest claimant count is Buckhaven, Methill and Wemyss Villages where 680 individuals were looking for work and claiming.

Leven, Kennoway and Largo had the highest proportion of male claimants (63.9%) which was the highest proportion in the City Region whilst East Neuk and Landward had 51.4% of claimants recording as female. With 27.9% of claimants being aged 16-24 Glenrothes Central and Thornton has the highest proportion of this age group in Fife. In Inverkeithing and Dalgety Bay 27.9% of the 215 claimants are over 50 years of age.

Table 16, below, looks at the in-work Universal Credit claimant numbers for the wards in Fife. Overall, there were 13,991 Fife residents working and claiming Universal Credit support in April 2024 which is 3.7% higher than in April 2024 and 11.7% higher than a year ago. Again, there are people needing this support across the Kingdom with every ward other than St Andrews recording over 300 claimants. Two wards, Buckhaven, Methil and Wemyss Villages and Lochgelly, Cardenden and Benarty both had over 1,000 people working but requiring Universal Credit support to supplement their income.

Midlothian

The Midlothian position is presented in Table 17 below. Looking at the change between June 2023 and June 2024 we can see that one ward (Penicuik) recorded a year-on-year increase of 10.8% and Midlothian East saw the claimant count increase by 4.4% between June 2023 and June 2024 and Midlothian West also recorded an increase. The remaining three wards saw the claimant count fall with Midlothian South recording a fall of 14.6% over the twelve month period. The change over the last month has seen one ward (Dalkeith) record a fall, two record an increase and three record no change. Once again, the high percentage changes can occur from *relatively* small changes in the actual number count- the 14.6% fall in Midlothian South is based on the count falling from 240 in June 2023 to 205 in June 2024.

We can see that overall, in Midlothian 57.1% of claimants are male, 19.5% are aged 16-24 and 18.8% are 50 or over. Looking at the wards themselves we can see that Penicuik had the highest proportion of male claimants. In terms of the age profile 24.4% of claimants in Midlothian South were 16-24 years of age in June 2024. We can also see that 25.6% of claimants in Midlothian West were over the age of 50.

Table 18 looks at the number of in work Universal Credit claimants in the 6 Midlothian wards. We can see that overall, there are 3,549 claimants in Midlothian in May 2024. This is 10.8% higher than in May 2023 and 1.2% lower than a month ago. All six wards saw a year on year increase ranging from a 17.2% increase in Penicuik to 4.5% increase in Midlothian South. Over the last month there has been an increase in the number of in work claimants in three Midlothian wards and fall in the other three.

West Lothian

The situation in West Lothian is looked at in Table 19 below. Overall, there were 3,135 claimants in West Lothian in June 2024, and this is 2.2% less than a year ago and 0.6% more than last month. We can see that 56% of claimants in West Lothian are male and 20.4% are aged between 16-24.

Looking at the wards in more detail we can see that five wards recorded a lower claimant number in June 2024 than in June 2023 and four had recorded a year on year increase. There is quite a contrast across the wards with the claimant count falling by 14.6% in Bathgate compared to Livingston North which saw the claimant count increase by 21.1% over the course of the year. Looking at the most recent month to month changes we can see that one ward recorded no change

between May and June (Armadale and Blackridge), two recorded a fall and the remaining six wards all saw the claimant count increase between May and June. Linlithgow saw it increase by 7.7% between May and June, although this is another ward with a relatively low claimant count to start with the result that this is based on ten additional claimants in June.

With a count of 520 claimants in June Whitburn & Blackburn had the most claimants of any West Lothian Ward. We can also see that in Fauldhouse and the Breich Valley Ward, 63.8% of claimants were male, in Bathgate 23.2% of claimants were 16-24 and in Linlithgow 28.6% of claimants were 50 or over.

Table 20 indicates that across West Lothian in April 2024 there were 6,989 individuals working and claiming Universal Credit which is 15.2% higher than a year ago and 2.2% lower than in April 2024. We can also see that only one ward has over 1,000 working Universal Credit claimants and apart from Linlithgow every ward has over 500 people working and relying on Universal Credit.

Overall, three wards have seen the claimant count fall year on year and six have seen it increase since June 2023. Two wards saw no change at all. In Selkirkshire the claimant count is 20.7% higher in 2024 than it was in 2023, currently 175 claimants compared to last year's figure of 145. Between May and June five Scottish Borders wards recorded an increase and four recorded a fall. Two wards recorded no change month to month. Kelso and District recorded a 14.3% increase between May and June 2024 based on the May figure of 140 increasing by 20 new claimants.

The data in Table 21 also indicates that 56.9% of claimants were male and 16.9% were 16-24 years of age. In Hawick and Hermitage 23.3% of claimants were 16-24 years of age and in Mid Berwickshire 39.4% of claimants were fifty or over.

Table 22 looks at the number of people in work and claiming Universal Credit in Scottish Borders. In May 2024 there were 4,029 people working who needed the support of Universal Credit. This is 18.8% higher than a year ago and almost the same as last month. Only one ward, Galashiels and District, has over 500 people working and claiming Universal Credit.

Economic Activity

The following section is based on economic activity rather than claimant count and the data underpinning it is derived from surveys. As a result, it can have margins of error and these margins of error can be considerable, particularly at a local level or when used to report on specific demographic groups.

Table 23 looks at the most recent data that can be broken down by Local Authority. It is based on twelve months survey data so reflects the position as of March 2024. It gives the economic activity rate in all six authorities and, of those that are economically inactive in each authority, the proportion and number who want a job. We can see that this suggests that across the Region 80.7% of those aged between 16-64 were economically active. Of the 172,400 who were recorded as economically inactive the survey indicates that around 34,000 would want a job.

It is worth noting that Economically Active includes in employment and those claiming an out of work benefit. Economically inactive are the more difficult to pinpoint group. So, if the estimates are correct these would be in addition to the claimant count figures looked at elsewhere in this report but can include groups who are not looking for work as they are studying, have health issues or looking after family.

The caveat with these statistics is that as it is a survey there are confidence limits provided with the data. This indicates the number which the statisticians are 95% confident would be correct if the survey had spoken to every eligible individual. For example, whilst the economic activity rate for Edinburgh is 84%, they are 95% confident that the real figure, based on the whole population, would be between 81.5% and 87.5% - the confidence levels recorded.
