Single Point of Contact

- No additional funding from Scottish Government for 2024/25 for No One Left Behind
- Since 1 April this year we have had over 650 referrals from DWP
- Edinburgh Guarantee team assessing and signposting referrals
- Monitoring capacity in the existing network of commissioned provision

NEST Third Party Grants (Stage 1-5) Third sector led support for people requiring specific barrier removal or from area of multiple deprivation 855 places

NOLB Stage 1 (Stage 1) Support for school leavers 180 places Next Step Edinburgh (Stage 3-4) Employability service, including specialist support for BAME community 360 places

Advance (Stage 5) In-work employment support with income maximisation 180 places

Intensive Family Support Service (Stage 1-2) A regional service that takes a tailored, needs-led approach to supporting families experiencing multiple disadvantages. 60 families (Edinburgh)

Subsidised Childcare for Working Parents (Stage 4-5) Provides subsidised places based on eligibility criteria with focus on regeneration areas communities 257 families

EnCompass (Stage 1-5) Support for people with a history of substance misuse, criminal justice, and homelessness 240 places

Parental Employment Support Fund (Stage 1-5) Providing intensive employability support to employed and unemployed parents from priority groups 813 places. Further support for 2024/25 via engagement with family support organisations including a focus on income maximisation for disabled parents.

Whole Family Equality Project (Stage 1-5) Project for ethnic minority communities in aiming to address poverty and inequality within these communities 40 places

All in Edinburgh (Stage 2-5) Supported Employment service for people with a disability or long-term health condition 425 places
